

# TRADITIONAL NOVEMBER BIRTHSTONE

#### CITRINE/TOPAZ

Citrine was usually thought to bring happiness, hope and cheer to the wearer. It is one of the few minerals which is thought to not hold any negative energies. Often referred to as the "Merchant's Stone" it is believed that placing a Citrine in a cash register will produce more income for the merchant. Natural healers use Citrine to chase away nightmares and ensure restful sleep. In ancient times it was carried as a protection from snake venom and evil thoughts. Citrine symbolizes self-confidence, healing, endurance, and mental clarity. Known as the "stone of strength" Topaz was thought to protect the wearer from all accidents while traveling, prevent injury in a fire, and rid one of all fear of death. If one wore Topaz on the left arm or around the neck it would break all evil enchantments and attract financial success. Topaz has been attributed with the widest range of curative powers of all the gemstones, and has been known to change colors in the presence of poison. It was also thought to enable the wearer to become invisible. Topaz symbolizes wisdom, courage, and sincerity.
