#### MAY FIELD TRIP

#### **Lavic Siding and Ludlow Thulite**

May 12 & 13, 2007 By Steve Duncan

The May field trip will be on May 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> to Lavic Siding and the Thulite area off of I-40 past Ludlow area. We will be camping on Lavic Siding road just off of National Trails Hwy. (old Route 66). This is between the Hector exit and the Ludlow exit off of I-40. Many of you are familiar with this campsite; it is easily accessibly by RVs. There are no hookups or facilities.

We will be collecting at Lavic Siding all day Saturday. Trips in the past yielded a lot of beautiful material, as usual the pickin's were better the farther we walked from the road. A lot of walking will improve your collecting, but it is easy walking without any steep hills. Most of the material is found in float.

Sunday we will collect Thulite at a location off of I-40 past Ludlow. This location is easy to access, with one short steep hill that we will drive up. Once at the top of the hill there is a flat space to park, and most of the Thulite collecting is within a couple of hundred yards. The Thulite can be dug (expanding existing holes), as well as found in float.

Trips will leave from the campsite at 0900 sharp both days.

We will have our usual potluck dinner and fire on Saturday evening.

#### **Directions to the campsite from Orange County:**

Take I-15 to Barstow, then I-40 towards Needles. Exit at the Hector exit, turn right at the end of the exit, and then left (east) on National Trails Hwy. National Trails Hwy. parallels the freeway for a while, and then makes a sharp left and crosses the freeway. Just at that left turn where the National Trails Hwy. crosses the freeway (about 10 miles?) Lavic Siding dirt road goes off to the right (south). We will be campled just inside Lavic Siding dirt road. Motels are available in Barstow, as well as one rustic motel in Ludlow (about 5 miles east of the campsite). Last time I checked you needed to check into this motel with the people running the gas station across the street.

#### NAME BADGES



#### **MAY BIRTHSTONE**

**EMERALD** 

The Gemstone Emerald is the green variety of the mineral Beryl. The wonderful green color of emerald is unparalleled in the gem kingdom. Emerald's precious green color is caused by small amounts of chromium and enhanced by traces of iron. Unlike other beryl, emeralds usually contain inclusions and other flaws. These flaws are not looked on as negative aspects for emerald like they would be for other gemstones. These flaws are considered part of the character of the stone and are used to assure the purchaser of a natural stone. Even artificial emeralds often contain flaws, however, as the process of growing artificial emeralds mimics the way nature does it (slow crystal growth from a molten mix). Nearly all emeralds, even many "natural" stones, have been treated to improve clarity, generally by immersing them in oil. For gemstones, a green-colored oil is often used, "improving" the color as well. Unfortunately, this oil may evaporate over the years, making flaws appear where none were visible at the time of purchase. A high-grade mineral oil may be used to improve the appearance again.
